The death certificate is important, for example, for • settling the estate • claiming statutory or private insurance benefits.

Voraussetzungen	An application for a death certificate can be made by • the last spouse • the last civil partner within the meaning of the Registered Civil Partnership Act • Ancestors and descendants of the deceased person • Siblings with a legitimate interest • other persons, provided they can credibly demonstrate a legal interest (e.g. by means of a letter from the probate court)
Kosten	A death certificate for private purposes costs €10.00.
Verfahrensablauf	You can usually apply for a death certificate in person, in writing or electronically at the relevant registry office.

Kurztext	• Issue of death certificate • every death must be reported to the registry office in whose jurisdiction the death occurred no later than the third working day following the death • a death certificate can be issued as soon as the death has been recorded in the death register • Applications for the issue of a death certificate can be made by the last spouse, the last civil partner within the meaning of the Registered Civil Partnership Act, ancestors and descendants of the deceased person or siblings with a legitimate interest and close relatives, such as aunts and uncles, who can credibly demonstrate a legal interest, for example by means of a letter from the probate court • The death certificate is important, for example, for the funeral and its preparation (e.g. for the coffin and transfer), the settlement of the estate, • claiming statutory or private insurance benefits Information from: competent registry office • Application via: Application must be submitted to the relevant registry office in person, in writing or electronically • Responsible: Registry office in whose jurisdiction the death occurred.
