Teaser	As a person entitled to international protection, you can apply for a residence permit to continue a course of study you started in another EU country if you meet certain requirements.
Volltext	<p>If you are recognized as a beneficiary of international protection in another EU member state and have been studying there for at least two years, you can obtain a residence permit to continue your studies in Germany.</p> <p>The residence permit for the continuation of studies started in another EU country is a temporary residence permit. It is issued for the duration of the part of your studies that is carried out in Germany.</p> <p>With your residence permit for the purpose of your studies, you are generally allowed to work for up to 120 days or 240 half days per year as well as take on student jobs.</p>

Kosten	<p>Issuing a residence permit: EUR 100.00</p> <p>Under certain conditions, a fee reduction or fee exemption may be possible.</p>
Verfahrensablauf	<p>You must apply for a residence permit at the foreigners authority responsible for your place of residence. The procedure is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Depending on the foreigners authority and your request, it may be possible to apply via the Internet. Find out whether your foreigners authority offers electronic application for a residence permit.</li> <li>• If you can only apply in person, make an appointment with the immigration office. During the appointment, your application will be accepted and your supporting documents checked (bring these with you to the appointment). Immigration Office will contact you after receiving your online application to arrange an appointment at the Immigration Office if necessary. During the appointment, your documents will be checked (bring them with you to the appointment) and your fingerprints will be taken for the production of the electronic residence permit (eAT card).

- If your application is approved, the Foreigners' Registration Office will arrange for the eAT card to be issued.
- After about six to eight weeks, you can collect the eAT card from the immigration office.
- The eAT card must always be collected in person.
- Fees are charged for the issue of the residence permit. The time and form of payment vary depending on the authority.

- Residence permit for the purpose of education Issued to continue studies started in another EU country
- Foreigners who have been studying in another EU member state for at least two years and are recognized there as persons entitled to international protection can obtain a residence permit to continue their studies in Germany.
- The residence permit is issued for the duration of the part of the course that is being completed in Germany.
- The residence permit entitles the holder to work for up to 120 days or 240 half days per year and to carry out part-time student activities.
- Depending on the Foreigners' Registration Office and your request, you can apply online or in person.
